Dear Mildred,

I don't feel like studying so I thought I would write instead. I'm with Ila Mae in her room, listening to the Hit Parade. Jo went to Rebecca's. Katherine went with Suzanne Boliver (or something like it) to a basketball game, they're playing Rolla. Suzanne (I don't know if that's spelled right or not) moved in today. She works for her board somewhere on the other end of town and one of the children there are sick. I believe she's going to stay here about 3 weeks. She's a good friend of Mary's, I knew her since the first of school. She lives in St. Louis and has ridden on the bus with us. She has the front bedroom.

I got a valentine from Corinne Paul and a great big valentine from Grace and Eleanor and a small one from "Booby." I sure was surprised because I didn't expect one from them. Also got a letter from Verna H.

Thursday night Mrs. Davis, Katherine, Helen, and I went to the opera. It was pretty good, a comic opera, but I didn't think the singing was so hot. Ila Mae and Jo said it wasn't nearly as good as last year. Mary, Roland N., and George F. were in it, I believe I told you. George F. sang a song or two by himself, he had one of the main parts. Stephen Blackhurst and Warren Huesman <sup>(of St. Charles)</sup> were in it too but I don't think either were. There was a red-headed boy at school that I saw quite often and I knew I had seen

him before but couldn't remember where. I asked Katherine once whether she knew who he was and she said he was Paul Ward of St. Charles. Then I remembered I had seen him at Weldon Springs Conference the other fall. He was a delegate from St. Charles church. I can't remember but I think he was at F. O. too, I'm not sure. Or that was last September, then he couldn't have either if he was going to school. I don't remember (if he was at F. O. or not).

Tuesday afternoon Katherine + I went to club meeting at Miss Patterson's apartment. Read children's stories and poems. Served jello and cookies. I guess you'll have to come next time because I have to serve. So! Katherine, two Foster sisters, and I. I believe we get money out of the treasury for eats. We also had our picture taken for the Echo.

Monday noon I ran into Mr. Harry Strong! I was going home at 12 and he just came out of the Junior High. He started getting into his car and I ran to catch him. He didn't remember me at first but when I told him who I was he said "Eunice Becker, Oh, sure I remember" and shook hands. He asked all about Augusta, seemed rather interested. We talked for awhile and he said I should drop in some afternoon and he wanted to talk. He teaches in the Junior High + also has an office in the Court-House. He had seen Gertrude M. but not Anna M. He also said something about

one of the Griffin girls going here, they live at Moberly now. I don't think she's going now, though.

Yesterday (Friday) afternoon Aileen and I went to see Mr. Schott again. Aileen has a chance of getting a school and is getting rather interested and wanted to find out some things. I must have misunderstood him the other time because I asked him again about teaching in another county and he said I could. In that case I can teach in Warren County if I send my grades there. Now I don't know what to do. I'd have a better chance of knowing of vacancies in St. Charles county than in Warren County but I guess there are fewer first class schools in the latter. So we're having the week before on Thurs. and will be through with the course. Have History <sup>finals</sup> Tuesday morning (22<sup>nd</sup>) at 8 till 10. Wednesday I have Hygiene & English. Have to make a final speech, reading and <sup>take a</sup> written exam in English. Also have a speech Monday and one Tuesday (my 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> one) Mr. Collins said a lot of the grade you got in speech was the attitude you took toward your work. A lot of kids cut class to avoid some speeches. Only a few of us made 7 which ~~is~~ was ~~supposed to be~~ the maximum. Yesterday he told each of us our difficulties. He's always saying something about me having a stiff upper lip but he told the others that because I was one of the few who had made 7 speeches I had the right attitude.

Never found out yet what I got in the Org. & Mgt. test last Monday but I thought it was very easy. I guess I'll get a low grade because I'm expecting a good grade. No more tests in History. Have a few more chapters but McClure said he wouldn't have time to grade them all & average them. Made a 100 and a 90 on my last two tests and raised my average to 81 1/2

which ought to be good for an S. Katherine's average is 60 something and she said it was less last quarter and she got an M out of the course then.

Wednesday morning Dr. Green didn't show up after 10 minutes of the class period was over so we all beat it home. ha!

The 14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, & 16<sup>th</sup> of March they're having some big Rural Educational meeting here and the Rural Leadership Club and the A. C. E. Katherine thought we could rent them. I wish I could take archery this spring or when it's offered.

I think I'll be home the 24<sup>th</sup> <sup>of May</sup> (26<sup>th</sup> is on Sunday) because the week preceding is Convocation Week and end of the quarter. I think I'll quit tonight & see what I know tomorrow. Sun. night — This has been the peakiest week-end I ever saw. I couldn't study for anything in the world. Got a speech written and that's about all. Katherine & I went to S. D. & church this morning. Mary, Bert, and Suzanne went to the Baptist church. Ma Mae & Jo are going to it — they're getting ready now. Laid around all afternoon and didn't get anything done. I'll be home the 26<sup>th</sup> and could be home maybe by the Thursday preceding if I had my exams on Tues & Wed. like I do this quarter but Ma Mae & Jo said that at the end of the spring quarter they usually didn't give the finals until Thurs. & Fri. Well I guess I'll quit now and see if I can get some studying done now - 7 o'clock.
