I made it after the Red Cross pattern. I don't have my second Red Cross sweater quite finished. I have one sleeve to knit ~~up~~ on it yet.

Tomorrow night the Juniors are giving their play at Pollock so will have to go there with them. They made about \$14. at the play Friday night. The schoolhouse was full but they charge only 10¢ admission.

Saturday Miss Clarke & I went to Kirksville, ~~Kennett~~ was the only girl at Davis's. End of the quarter and everyone else had gone home.
