Well, at last I'm going to write. This is my fourth letter tonight and I have to write to Esther too.

I'm taking Background, Science, Practice Teaching (4th grade Arith.), Children's Literature, Current Affairs, and Physical Ed. I'll get my state 60-hr. certificate at the end of the quarter. I don't know if I'll take music lessons or not. They're too high at the college.

This is a nice place where we are staying. A nice kitchen altho it is rather small. Mary Fowellman, Martha Brandt (the two girls from Davis), Ruth & I are cooking together & we have better meals than I ever did when doing our own cooking. Mary

plans the meals & we each pay a
1. a week.

There are ten girls staying
here. Mary & Martha in one room (there
is room for 2 more in their room; Lucille
Riggs, Louise Rernick, and Anna Merle
Norton in another room; and Ruth,
Lucile Prickett (a friend of Ruth's) & I in
the other room upstairs. There are two
girls downstairs but I don't even
know their names.

There are only about three
dozen boys in school, so it seems.
I don't believe the enrollment is nearly as
high as formerly.

Miss Willson & Marie are
living quite a ways from where I
stay. I saw their place but didn't
like it very much. I can't think
of anything else.
