Dear Mr. Webbink:

Receipt is acknowledged of your application for disability benefits which has been made a part of your permanent records in your case file.

Present regulations will permit this office to arrange for a physical examination in connection with your claim only if evidence is submitted showing present disabilities of that severity which may be considered permanently and totally disabling. In view of this fact, it is suggested that you furnish this office with evidence of your present condition in the form of a statement from a physician who has recently treated or examined you.

In the event that you are unable to furnish a statement from your physician, you may submit evidence of your present condition in the form of statements from persons other than physicians. Such statements should be in affidavit form, that is, notarized or sworn to before a person authorized to administer oaths, and should set forth the affiant's observation as to your physical condition.

Dear Mr. Webbink:

Favorable action has been taken with reference to your claim for non-service connected disability pension. However, before payment can be authorized additional information is required.

Under present veteran's law, nonservice connected disability pension is not payable when a veteran having a wife or minor child, has an income in excess of \$2500.00 annually, or when a veteran without dependents has an income in excess of \$1000.00 annually.

Your records are not clear as to your annual net income for the year 1951 and as to your anticipated net income for the year 1952. In addition, your claims folder does not contain proof of your marriage.

In order that full consideration can be given to your possible entitlement to disability pension, kindly complete and return to this office, the enclosed Questionnaire. In addition, you should furnish this office with an exact copy of your income tax return covering the year 1951, together with your statement as to your anticipated income for the year 1952. Your statement should contain the following certification: "I certify that the information given above is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief," in which case it will not be necessary for you to have your statement notarized.

It is further suggested that you furnish this office with a certified copy of the public record of your marriage, which can be obtained from the Recorder of Deeds in the county wherein your marriage license was issued, probably without charge to you if you state in your application it is required in connection with a claim pending before the Veterans Administration.

When you have furnished this office with the above requested evidence, you will be promptly informed of the action taken.

NOTICE

Payment of pension may be affected by any one of the following occurrences which should be promptly called to the attention of this Administration:

1. Decrease in disability.
2. Failure to furnish evidence requested by the Veterans Administration.
3. Commission of fraud by the person receiving compensation or pension or with his knowledge.
4. Hospital treatment, institutional or domiciliary care by the Veterans Administration.
5. Annual income of any unmarried person in excess of \$1,000 or annual income of any married person, or person with minor children in excess of \$2,500.
6. Receipt of active service or retirement pay.
7. Death of a veteran or a dependent.

IMPORTANT PROVISIONS OF LAW

Title I, Section 13, Public Act No. 2, 73d Congress.--"That if any person entitled to payment of pension under this title whose right to such payment under this title or under any regulation issued under this title ceases upon the happening of any contingency thereafter fraudulently accepts any such payment, he shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$2,000 or by imprisonment for not more than one year or both."

Section 3, Public 262, 74th Congress.--"Payments of benefits due or to become due shall not be assignable, and such payments made to, or on account of, a beneficiary under any of the laws relating to veterans shall be exempt from taxation, shall be exempt from the claims of creditors, and shall not be liable to attachment, levy, or seizure by or under any legal or equitable process whatever, either before or after receipt by the beneficiary. Such provisions shall not attach to claims of the United States arising under such laws nor shall the exemption herein contained as to taxation extend to any property purchased in part or wholly out of such payments..."
