COOKS COUNCIL

INDIVIDUAL SPAGHETTI CASSEROLLES. 1 cup diced turkey or chicken 1 cup cooked peas. Place— 1 large (14 oz) can cooked spaghetti in tomato sauce in two layers in individual casseroles, placing the meat mixture between the two layers of spaghetti.

BEFSTEAK MACARONI PIE. Combine, mixing well— 1 lb. round steak, ground 2 teaspoons salt 1/2 teaspoon pepper. Line 8 individual pie pans with the meat mixture, forming a meat crust. Fill centers with— 2 medium (17 oz) cans cooked macaroni in cream sauce with cheese using about a fourth of a can for each pie.

MACARONI BARBET. Melt 1/2 stick butter. 2 tablespoons butter. Add, cooking until tender, but retaining their crispness— 1 tablespoon chopped onion 1 cup diced celery 2 tablespoons chopped green pepper.
